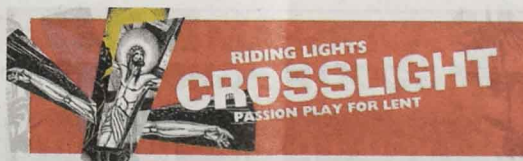

## TALKING POINT

### THE SEARCH FOR REAL SECURITY

*What will the Church of the future look like?*

These are extraordinary times. If, one year ago, I had predicted that Donald Trump would become President of the United States of America and that the UK would be leaving the European Union, most people would have thought that I had either taken leave of my senses or had absolutely no understanding of politics. But both have happened. We live in times when it is impossible to predict what will happen next and that is both exciting and deeply challenging.

At a personal level, we are all aware of how quickly life can change. The loss of a loved one; the onset of disease; the news of an accusation; the shock of a car accident; the agony of a business failure – all these, and a thousand others, can redefine our lives in an instant. Our churches are amazing communities within which we can support and care for one another amidst the inevitable ups and downs of life. But the one thing that our churches cannot do is to prevent our lives being shaken. Uncertainty is woven into the fabric of our lives.

Wherever we look we are reminded that human life is characterized by change. Sometimes the change is slow and sometimes fast, but change is inevitable and we should neither be surprised by it nor seek to protect ourselves from it. The Bible does not present us with a God who protects us from change but rather one who offers to walk with us through the challenges of life. In Isaiah chapter 43 we don't read that God offers to help us to avoid walking through the waters or fire, but he is the one who promises that he will be with us as we pass through them.

In times of profound change I suggest that everyone needs to ask the question – where is my security? Our health, our money, our jobs and our status are clearly all very transient. They offer us only very temporary security. But God offers us something different. He offers us a kingdom which is not of this world and which is utterly secure. In the letter to the Hebrews, the writer tells his readers that we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken (Hebrews chapter 12 verse 28). Surely it is this kind of security that we all want. A security which lasts for time and for eternity.

Our society tends to shy away from talking about death and what lies beyond this life. The New Testament is the opposite! In fact St Paul goes so far as to say that anyone whose hope is restricted to this life, is most to be pitied (1 Corinthians chapter 15 verse 19). During these weeks of Lent it is good that we should deliberately focus on our long term future because that is where our real security lies. The truth is that it is only when we have grasped our eternal security that we will have the peace and strength to live this life to the full.

I have no doubt that there will be many more events that will shake us, at home and abroad, in the course of this year. That's life! So let us make sure that our eyes are fixed on the Kingdom that cannot be shaken. That's our real security.

The voice said, "Jump off a high tower. God's angels will save you. Everyone will listen to you then!"

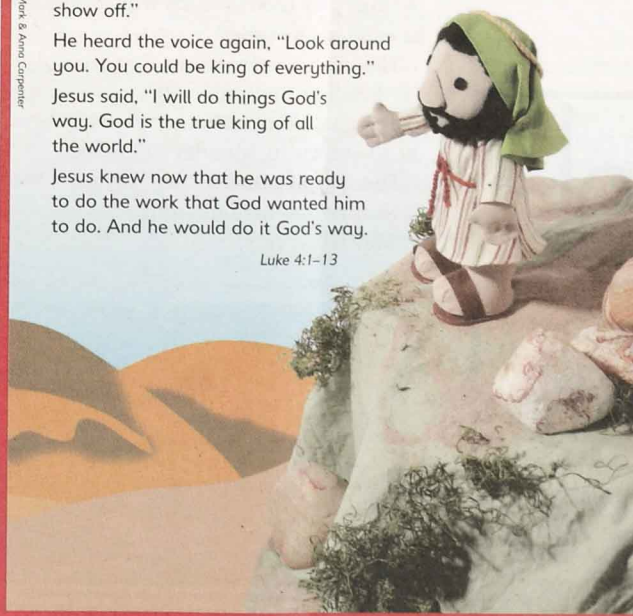

## Changes to Concessionary Bus Pass Use from April 2017

PENSIONERS are being reminded that they will no longer be able to use their concessionary bus passes before 9.30am on weekdays from April 1st.

Unlike many other local authority areas, Reading borough council still offers its residents a concessionary bus pass scheme over and above the national scheme. That will come to an end from April 1st, after the council last year announced it was having to remove its subsidy as a result of budget pressures and increased demands on services.

The change means pensioners who are used to using their concessionary bus pass from 9am, will from April 1st need to wait until 9.30am to make their journeys. Revised hours of use in Reading will be 9.30am to 11pm, Monday to Friday, which are the hours permitted by the national concessionary fares scheme.

Weekend and Bank Holiday use of the concessionary bus pass remains unchanged, meaning pensioners can still use them at any time. Concessionary bus passes will however no longer be accepted for use on football or rugby buses operated by Reading Buses or Stagecoach.

A public information campaign began in January to ensure people are aware of the changes well in advance of their introduction in April. Reading Buses have begun putting messages on bus screens and notices on the buses to explain the changes.

Tony Page, Reading borough council's lead member for strategic environment, planning and transport, said:



"For many years this Council has offered Reading residents a bus concessionary scheme over and above the national scheme, meaning pensioners could take advantage by boarding buses from 9am, instead of 9.30am. The removal of the Council subsidy, reluctantly announced last year, means the Reading scheme will soon replicate those offered in other local authority areas where no council subsidy was provided.

"I would stress that there are no proposed changes in Reading to the issue and acceptance of Access Passes for disabled persons' bus travel, which will continue to be valid at any time."

The changes also mean that from April 1st Reading borough will stop accepting Wokingham concessionary passes between 09.00 and 09.30, Monday to Friday.

The arrangement to accept West Berkshire pass holders from 9.00am ended in May last year.

Spring is in the air and so are the voices of the 100-plus singers of the South Chiltern Choral Society, performing Mozart's iconic Requiem on Saturday 8th April. Together with professional soloists and orchestra, and conducted by Paul Burke, the choir will also spring into Schubert's more exuberant Mass No 3 in B Flat.

Paul Burke explains that "Franz Schubert's *Mass in Bb*, written when the composer was just eighteen, was premiered in Vienna in 1815 and sets the Latin text of the Catholic Mass for choir, four soloists, and orchestra. Full of exuberance, the piece energetically encompasses a wide range of musical moods during its thirty-minute span. Of particular note are the Credo, which quotes that text's traditional plainsong melody above a scurrying orchestral accompaniment, and the Agnus Dei which provides a lilting, dance-like conclusion and inevitably provokes comparisons with the famous Viennese waltzes of the later nineteenth century."

Paul points out that "a piece as iconic as Mozart's *Requiem* needs little introduction; its sublime music and its association with the composer's death have ensured it a special place in history. Setting the Latin text of the Catholic Mass of the Dead for choir, soloists, and orchestra, the Requiem was left unfinished at Mozart's death and was completed by one of his pupils. It is in this version that the piece is most often performed today, and despite its dual authorship the music speaks clearly and powerfully. Especially impressive are the solemn Kyrie fugue and the *Lacrimosa* which magically combines fear and consolation in equal measure. It is no wonder then that speculation continues about Mozart's state of mind when writing his *Requiem* and about the circumstances of his death, the most recent example being the very successful play and film *Amadeus*."

# The Pagoda, Caversham Bridge

Recently, I've been going through a collection of over 1000 postcards and photographs of the Reading area which belonged to a keen local historian. I knew him slightly, and was sorry to hear that he had passed away. Nevertheless I was pleased and honoured to be asked by his executors to find a good home for the pictures.

This postcard caught my eye because I knew of no pagoda near Caversham Bridge, and the building in the photograph looks nothing like a pagoda. Where could it have been?

I've had some idea of what a pagoda looked like since the age of four. About 1950 it was a family Sunday custom to visit my grandmother, who had been widowed in the First World War. In the front room of her small house was a very large oak sideboard, and along the back of it was a groove, to take plates. Lodged in the groove, and resting against the wall behind, was a set of blue-and-white willow pattern plates, with the bridge, the trees with catkins, and a pagoda. Soon after I started school in 1951, I can remember trying to draw a pagoda. My teacher asked me if I knew what a pagoda was for, and told me that in China, it was a kind of temple.

So quite why you would call what is obviously an English tea-room a pagoda, if the building looked nothing like a pagoda, I can't guess.

A search through the old street directories in the Central Library soon revealed that the Pagoda refreshment rooms were at No. 227 Caversham Road, by 1909.

In those days, Richfield Avenue did not exist, and there was a path between the Pagoda and the Caversham Bridge hotel,



leading to the recently-constructed Thames side promenade. Perhaps I should explain that the present-day Crowne Plaza hotel was built on the site of the Caversham Bridge hotel and its gardens.

The tea-room was called the Pagoda until the time the 1966 directory was

compiled, but in the 1967 edition, the name has changed to the Viking café. 1967 is also the directory in which Richfield Avenue appears for the first time.

The new name was probably meant to conjure up images of the Vikings coming up the Thames in their long-boats, to be met by King Alfred and his army in the year 871. The name was changed again to the Gorge in 1989. Since the River Thames isn't exactly in a gorge when it reaches Caversham Bridge, perhaps the new name was supposed to make you think you were being swallowed up into something warm and comforting as you went in. Maybe it's just the redness of the interior décor which makes me think that. Of course, the idea could just be that this was somewhere where you could gorge yourself – and you still can!

The intrusion of Richfield Avenue and the petrol station means that there is no longer a garden with rose-hung pergolas and tables and chairs behind the café. But at least it should be easier to get by car from Caversham to West Reading and Tilehurst – and maybe it will be, once the notorious narrow railway arch is removed!

## The Caversham Heights Society

Society members listened to two diverse, but enthralling, talks in January.

On 4th John Mullaney, who for many years was the proud owner with his wife, Lindsay, of Caversham Bookshop in Prospect Street, was due to talk about the significance of King Henry 1st [1100-1135] to Reading but in the end it was Lindsay who gave the talk. John will speak at the end of the season on the importance of Reading Abbey.

Lindsay went into considerable detail about the Normans and the family feuds of William the Conqueror's [1027-87] family and where Henry fitted in. Henry was the youngest, and only English born, son of William 1st and was involved in various family feuds and intrigues that Lindsay revealed in great detail, interspersed with wry and humorous comments. She pointed out that redheads and beards were frowned upon by the church at the time because long hair was seen as synonymous with either homosexuality or criminality but because the Normans were descended from the hairy Norsemen of Scandinavia and because William 11 Rufus [1056-1100] was bisexual the church proved powerless to exert their views. These attitudes also meant that it was very hard to identify what Henry might have looked like from the various 'portraits' of him. It is only recently that some degree of clarity has begun to be revealed. But why Reading? Apparently it was of strategic importance to the Normans situated as it is on the Kennet and near the Thames and not too far from the New Forest. Henry was familiar with the place because he stayed in Sonning on numerous occasions and Reading Abbey, with its associations with Cluny, the then largest abbey in Europe, was planned by Henry to become the burial site for future kings and from what is known now it was the largest abbey in England. Henry was, by every account, a great king. He ended private wars between barons by imposing draconian taxes and punishments; he introduced travelling law courts; he developed an efficient bureaucracy, including an exchequer that was the forerunner of today's Treasury; he reformed the coinage; he clarified the roles that belonged to the state and those that belonged to the church. Above all the economy thrived because his reign coincided with 30 years of peace. Henry's remains were brought from Normandy back to Reading for burial in the abbey following his untimely death from eating an excess of lampreys. Yet few visitors to Reading would be aware of the existence of Reading Abbey let alone Henry's importance. With the current exploration of the abbey ruins, using the latest laser technology, who knows what the situation might become in a few years' time?

Hugh Granger's talk on the 18th on the life of Sir Barnes Wallis [1887-1979] was even more detailed and enthralling. He explored Wallis's humble origins, his scholarship to Christ's Hospital, his mathematical tripos at Cambridge and his subsequent career with Vickers Ltd where he designed the R100 airship which made its maiden flight in 1929 and subsequently successfully crossed the Atlantic. He came up with different practical solutions to aeronautical problems, which were always successful but were often rejected because he did not fit into the 'right' mould. He is best known for his design of the Wellington bomber, the bombs that destroyed the German battleship Tirpitz, and the 'bouncing bombs' that were used to destroy the Mohne and Eder dams in the Ruhr in 1943. Even after World War 2 he continued to use his genius for design by developing the first swing wing aircraft used in the Tornado fighter and by developing plans for supersonic aircraft. Given Wallis's contribution to winning World War 2 and his patenting of over 140 designs the scandal is how little recognition was given to him by the

political establishment for all his efforts. For example Churchill never mentioned him in his History of the Second World War, perhaps because of his own conscience about the role of Bomber Command.

## CLUBS

### Probus

The speaker at the January meeting of the Reading and District Probus club was Tony King whose subject was *The Old Bath Road*. The talk was both informative and fascinating with some interesting anecdotes that were given throughout the talk. The speaker admitted to becoming interested in the topic after reading *And So to Bath* by a Cecil Roberts who was born in 1892, and later lived at Pilgrim Cottage near the Golden Ball off the Henley to Wallingford road. The Golden Ball was used as a coaching inn, and serviced stage coaches to Birmingham, Oxford and Reading, which had diverted from the London to Bath road (now the A4).

The 18th and early 19th centuries were the golden era for the stage coach, which became the wonder of the Georgian age as people wanted to travel faster and faster. Before this the only way for ordinary people to travel was on horse, but the rich had their own private coaches. Stage coaches also carried the Royal Mail, which was expected to be delivered to all corners of the realm. The first postal service used in this way began on 16 September 1784. By 1785, 11 routes had been established. At first it took three days to travel from London to Bath, at a cost of 25 shillings. Eventually the Royal Mail managed Bristol to London in 16 hours.

There were tolls levied at certain points on the route. There was frequently congestion at Hyde Park Corner. Starting at The Swan with Two Necks in Cheapside, the route ran through Piccadilly, past Green Park and Hyde Park Corner and Knightsbridge, to the major stop at Hounslow, the first stop for changing horses, and which at its heyday coped with 3000 horses a day. Then on to Isleworth, from where there were two routes west.

The fastest coach carried passengers from London to Bath in three days 'if God permits'. This was a big 'if' because of the terrible roads, often horrendous weather conditions and the dangers of highwaymen. Indeed, in 1812, all the passengers and coachmen froze to death in, and on, one coach. Even now there are still famous public houses along the Old Bath Road, as well in other parts of the country, that used to stable thousands of horses and provide hospitality to the travellers.

The most famous highwayman was Dick Turpin (1715-1739), whose real name was John Palmer, and who was executed at Tyburn. (There were 13 gibbets between Hounslow and Heston.) The highwaymen would learn which coaches would stop at certain hostleries and what wealth was being conveyed so that they could plan their ambushes. From 1763 the Bow Street Runners patrolled Hounslow Heath. Many of the highwaymen acquired considerable wealth but their days were numbered, as were those of the stage coaches, with the arrival of the first steam coach in 1829, which could travel from London to Bath at a speed of 15mph, followed by the railways in the 1830s.

This was a fascinating talk on an interesting stage in the development of transport in this country.

Probus is a club for retired men, who enjoy a meal once a month in the congenial company of like-minded men. Lunch is followed by a talk on a variety of interesting subjects.
