

# Lift high the cross at St Margaret's

Members of the congregation of St Margaret's Church, Mapledurham, are most grateful for a recent grant of £13,000 from the Government's Listed Places of Worship Roof Repair Fund. Approval came just in time as there was an urgent need to replace worn tiles on the roof of the tower and the nave of this Grade One listed building and the church could not afford to fund the full cost itself. A close inspection by the church's architect, Robin Nugent, indicated that the lead flashing protecting a large Celtic cross directly above the chancel step needed urgent attention and the cross itself, weighing well over a hundred kilos, was soon likely to come crashing down through the ceiling below as the oak support beneath it had rotted away.

It is most probable that the cross was placed there during the extensive alterations and additions to the church in 1863, when the well known Tractarian architect, William Butterfield, was instructed by the then vicar, the Revd Richard Coleridge. Unfortunately, Mr Coleridge and Mr Butterfield went well beyond the faculty granted by the diocese at the time and much of the work went undocumented. Butterfield was one of the great exponents of the Gothic revival and a most prolific architect. Among his many admired works are Keble College in Oxford, All Saints' Church, Margaret Street in London and the Cathedral of the Isles, Great Cumbrae in Scotland.

The Revd Richard Coleridge was a nephew of the poet, Samuel Taylor Coleridge, and had been an exact contemporary of Edward Pusey, a founder of the Tractarian Movement, at Eton College. He was a co-founder of St Augustine's Missionary College in Canterbury and, before coming to Mapledurham, had been a very popular master at Eton and was married to a daughter of Dr John Keate, the College's longest serving headmaster. Mr Coleridge bore the total cost of the 1863 restoration of St Margaret's from his own resources.

The most recent work was carried out by Stone Technical Services Group Ltd of Darlington who had recently carried out remedial work on St Paul's Cathedral and on Westminster Abbey's chapter house. The cross was taken to their Durham workshop and returned, looking just as good as it did when first placed on the roof.

Peter Stratton, a churchwarden at St Margaret's, who supervised the contract on behalf of the parish, was very pleased to see the work completed. He said, "The cross is a clear sign of our Christian fellowship here and will be appreciated by all who visit this peaceful location at Mapledurham in this beautiful part of South Oxfordshire".

St Margaret's is a pilgrim church and is open every day throughout the year for Sunday worship and for private prayer and meditation. There has been a place of Christian worship on the site for well over 900 years. One of its previous vicars was the Revd John Bird Sumner, who later became Bishop of Chester and, subsequently, Archbishop of Canterbury. He was succeeded at St Margaret's by the Revd Lord Augustus FitzClarence, a natural son of King William IV and the only known son of a British monarch to have been ordained in the Church of England. More recently, St Margaret's achieved universal fame by featuring extensively in the film *The Eagle has Landed*, which featured Sir Michael Caine, Jenny Agutter and Donald Sutherland.

## TALKING POINT

A few years ago I joined a number of my old school friends at a dinner to mark fifty years since we moved out into the big wide world. Strangely, it was not so much the faces that I remembered, but the voices.

This year we have been remembering the Battle of the Somme, a key battle in the First World War, evoking both awe and reverence and, for many, incalculable sadness. The voices of the fallen are silent. Through photographs we can see their faces, but very few can now be remembered as voices. It is surely important that we listen for those voices, to understand what they believed they were fighting for.

This is not just about memories of people, as if it were a family album. It is not to be dismissed simply as 'living in the past', eking out precious memories of years gone by, lest too soon they fade altogether. We remember, we listen for those voices, in order to live our own lives better in the present moment. As we salute them for their sacrifice in the service of the values, the human and social treasures, that have shaped our nation, we are prompted to ask ourselves a very serious question. To what extent do we, in our present national life, continue to sustain those values, those treasures? It is surely idle to profess solemn remembrance for those who made sacrifices if in our daily living we fail to honour and cherish that for which they were willing to give life and limb.

But wait a minute! Those Veterans of the First World War certainly gave their lives for a cause, but we must surely ask ourselves: what exactly was the shape of the world and of their own society that they were willing to give their lives for? Watching television series like *Downton Abbey* is no doubt wonderfully entertaining and enlightening but does it represent a world which we must preserve for all time? Can we imagine our contemporary soldiers sharing precisely that vision of what is worth dying for?

So, how do we hear those distant voices, speaking to us across four or perhaps five generations? The intervening century has brought change and we are warned that these processes of change are continuing apace. Across the world people have been rallying around ideas and projects which we may find admirable, or horrifying. Part of our responsibility to the past is, I believe, to ask questions about how our values, our social treasures, can be sustained through change, possibly dramatic change. A prime example can be found in the pattern of good neighbourliness which we have shown to people fleeing persecution. Do we regard that as a worthy social treasure? If so, how do we sustain it in our own day?

We remember the past in order to shape our approach to a changing global order. The nature of power and conflict are both changing. What pattern of warfare might emerge? What pattern of peace might emerge? Would it be something that we could recognise as 'peace'? What might be our nation's role in future conflagrations? If we need to ask more generations of young people to stand ready to make sacrifices, how are we to ensure that those demands are made in good faith, and for good reasons? It comes back, doesn't it, to those values, those social treasures.

#### Hezekiah and Isaiah

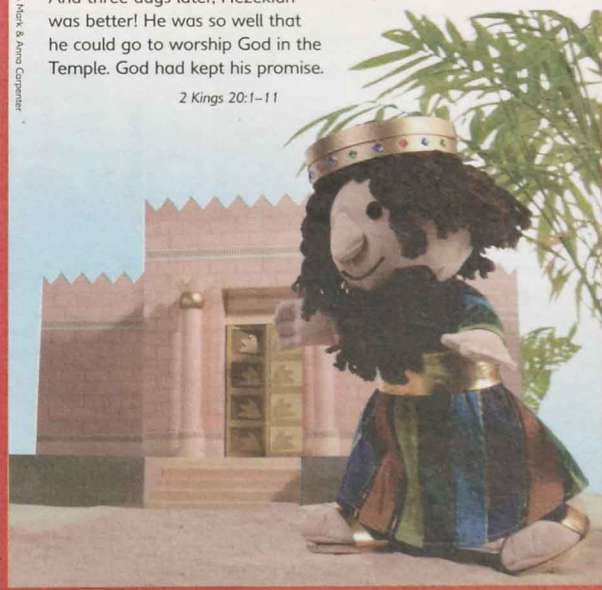


King Hezekiah was very ill. He talked to God. "I have always tried to do what you wanted," King Hezekiah said, crying because he was so sad and he felt so poorly.

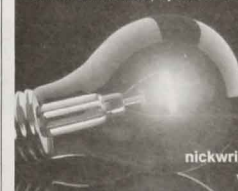

## ENVIRONMENT

## THE PRIORY

In recent weeks I have been glancing with interest through the wire fence, looking at the building work going on at the corner of Hemdean Road and Rectory Road. This was the site of the house called The Priory, which gave its name to Priory Avenue.

It never was a priory, but it stood on the site of the building that in the Middle Ages belonged to Notley Abbey, which was near Thame. It had the extraordinary name of The Portaryens, which I have never seen explained and may be the Anglicisation of a Latin name.

Notley was endowed with the church, the Chapel of Our Lady of Caversham, the holy well on Priest Hill, and the chapel on the great bridge at Caversham. The Portaryens was the lodging of the Canon of Caversham and his servants, who looked after things and collected the offerings from the pilgrims. Dr London, who was Warden of New College Oxford, arrived on the orders of Henry VIII to supervise the demolition of Chapel of Our Lady and to seize its statue, treasures and holy relics. He wrote that 'at Caversham there is a proper lodging where the Canon lay, with a fair garden and orchard... The Canon had nothing to do but keep the chapel and receive the offerings.' He was telling his masters what they wanted to hear, of course.

In the Central Library is an unpublished *History of Caversham* by Sarah Tate, well worth delving into. In 1965, a couple of years before it was demolished, she had visited The Priory. Among much else, she reports that the stone wall of the sitting-room was very thick – unusual because there is no good building stone in the area, so this must have been a house of some importance. The scullery was reached down steps from the kitchen, and had once been a separate building. The cellars were vast and vaulted, and older than the house itself, leading one to suspect that The Priory may have been built on the site of the Canon's lodging.

The Priory had its ghost. In the mid-nineteenth century, when the house was occupied by the Worthington family, a great-aunt of Mrs Tate, as a young woman, had gone there to work as a nurse to the children. She had said that she used to hear strange noises in the night, and that one morning she had come downstairs and was surprised to find "an elderly clergyman, dressed in the style of an earlier age" in the room. As she approached, he disappeared up the chimney!

In the grounds of The Priory but on Church Street, there was another old building, which was demolished in 1907 for road-widening. The two map extracts, from 1898 and 1936, suggest that this must be the tiny building between the C and the H of 'Church' on the earlier map. It must have stood on part of the site of the Day Lewis chemist's shop and post office, and it ended its days as a pub called The Bricklayers' Arms. You can see how the road-widening would have meant the end of it.

The Central Library's picture collection has two attractive watercolours by Julia Bockett showing The Priory in 1832, and a photograph of people in the garden during the time of the Worthingtons. You can see them online by finding the 'Reading library catalogue' and searching on 'Caversham priory'.

## CLUBS

### The Caversham Heights Society

The society opened its 2016/17 season on 21st September with an interesting and rather detailed talk by John Brierley on The Verney family of Claydon in Buckinghamshire. A story of love, war and madness in the Civil War. At least that was the title that was billed for the evening. In fact it was much more a commentary on the tumultuous period of social and religious upheaval in England in the seventeenth century with the story of the Verney family loosely set against this background. The talk was detailed and informative and was based on considerable research. It was also laced with humour and insights into, and comments on, English society at that time. What was striking was that while historians are aware of the lives of the higher echelons in society- the monarchy, nobility, aristocracy, and the top clergy- remarkably little is known about the lives of the common people, the 'freeborn Englishmen' and yeomen.

The 17th century was essentially a time of political and religious upheaval, especially between 1640 and 1660, which saw the English Civil War, the execution of Charles I in 1649, and the Commonwealth Parliament under Oliver Cromwell. It was a period of antagonism against the monarchy and nobility, especially the bishops, and there was regicide against Charles I. Amazingly the country never descended into the anarchy such as led to the French Revolution. It could so easily have done so because there was a very clear social hierarchy where 5% of the population, who had the wealth and power, controlled the 95%, and because men clearly dominated society, though John Brierley did cite examples of women who showed remarkable courage and determination in difficult circumstances.

Out of a population of roughly 5 million, 100,000 were either killed or injured during the Civil War and another one million lived on charity. The changes that began included the creation of the Royal Society in 1660 and other scientific organisations, the creation of banks, the building of great houses for the landed gentry, many of which were destroyed in the 1950s and 1960s until the National Trust and English Heritage stepped in to preserve them for the nation. It was also a time of great diarists such as John Evelyn and Samuel Pepys and following the Plague and Great Fire of London [1664-66] we saw the rise of a merchant class and the beginnings of social mobility and political parties.

We know so much about what was happening because of the Verney family. They were granted Claydon House by King John [1165-1216] and were given even more lands by Edward IV [1367-1413]. As a family they were involved in numerous battles, for example Sir Edward Verney was the royal standard bearer who lost his life at the battle of Edgehill [1642], but by and large they were more of an 'in between' family who sought to improve the lot of their tenants and employees rather than seek higher status through the royal court. We know this because of the findings of Sir Henry Verney who inherited the Claydon estate in 1827 and found over 100,000 family documents dating back to the 14th century and 30,000 letters that were written during the three years of the Civil War, equivalent to 60 letters a week! Amongst these papers were diaries and details of debates in the Houses of Parliament, strictly forbidden but a mine of information to future historians, as well as social commentaries on the times.

While the talk was at times difficult to follow it was nevertheless a fascinating talk for a historian.

The society meets on the first and third Wednesdays at 7.30pm for 8pm from September to April in Caversham Heights Methodist Church hall on Highmoor Road. Visitors and new members are always welcome. 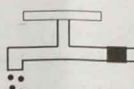
