TALKING POINT

I love candles. Sometimes when the pace of life gets too frenetic, and it feels like there are too many plates to keep spinning, I retreat to the armchair in my study, light a simple candle that sits on the coffee table, and just watch the flame. It's restful, peaceful, and somehow the opposite of frenetic. It helps me to slow down, to find time to breathe, and to simply rest in the presence of God.

I love Christmas, too. I love the excitement on children's faces as they anticipate and unwrap presents. I love the emphasis on being together, with friends and family, even when relationships may have been strained. I love the sense of goodwill, of giving, of making the effort, of celebrating. And I love the wonder of the Christmas story – angels appearing to Mary, Joseph and a bunch of poor shepherds on a hillside, frightening the life out of them. A baby, in a manger of all places! Rich wise men travelling a vast distance following a star. Political leaders getting in a tizzy. There's a sense that something extraordinary is going on. Something supernatural. Something heavenly.

John, in the first chapter of his gospel, explains what was happening that night. *"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God... The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world."*

Jesus, the Son of God, who was involved in the creation of the world, chose to leave behind all the glory and majesty of heaven and come to earth, to become human, and to live among us. To be our light, showing us how to live, and showing us God. Making it possible for us to know God. Not just know about Him, but know Him, as our heavenly Father.

"But to all who received Him, who believed in His name, he gave power to become children of God."

On that amazing night, heaven was breaking through to earth. Jesus was coming on a rescue mission, coming not just to live among us, but also to die for us, to remove the barrier of sin that separates us from a holy God. Coming to drive out darkness.

And that's the other reason I love candles. When I watch the flame, I am reminded of Jesus, the Light of the World, who dispels darkness, and whose power can transform any situation, no matter how dark it may look from a human perspective. Heaven still breaks through to earth whenever someone welcomes Jesus into their heart. He still comes to anyone who invites Him. The fire of His love still burns.

May you know the light and life and love of Jesus deep in your heart this Christmas, and throughout the year ahead.

Figs at Christmas

This month, I should like to consider a plant which grows in many Caversham gardens, my own included, and which is particularly connected with Christmas celebrations.

I suppose that my first acquaintance with *Ficus carica*, the botanical name of the fig, must have come at a time before I can remember. In the 1940s and 50s, parents seem to have been very concerned about 'regularity,' and to have administered mild laxatives to their children on the slightest provocation. I have a younger brother, and I can remember him being dosed with a preparation called 'California Syrup of Figs.' I tried it, and it tasted pretty good. An Internet search has shown that the producers did in fact begin in San Francisco, California, and that by the 1890s they had a presence in this country.

My next encounter with figs came in the form of those blocks of partially dried and sweetened whole figs, wrapped in cellophane, which appeared in the shops at Christmas. They usually came from Izmir in Turkey. They were often displayed along with boxes of dates, which came from somewhere in north Africa. The boxes were unusual, made of thin wood, and with rounded ends.

People with false teeth didn't like the figs, because the tiny hard seeds got under their 'plates' and irritated their gums, but then onto the market came Batger's Chinese Figs. These were large brown sweets, made of jelly which tasted of fig, and dusted with sugar to stop them all sticking together. There were no irritating seeds there.

I never saw 'natural' figs until I came to Reading in 1969. I liked



them, and after I got married I began helping my in-laws with their large garden. They had two small unheated greenhouses. One of them I used for tomatoes, peppers, aubergines, cucumbers and melons, and the other one had just a grape-vine and a fig tree. I'm sure that my in-laws thought that the fig tree would be a waste of time, but it soon romped away and started fruiting. I was able to ripen two crops of figs in a year – all I wanted and more. I even tried making fig jam! The fig in the picture came from that greenhouse, about 30 years ago.

Figs are large, interesting plants, with big lobed leaves which remind me of Adam and Eve. The 'fruit,' which technically isn't a fruit, starts as a kind of sac, with a hole at the end opposite the stalk. It contains lots of tiny flowers, and the little hole is to enable tiny wasps to enter and pollinate them. Figs are native to the Mediterranean and the Middle East, so when they tried growing them in California, they had to take care to import the wasps as well. The kind of figs we usually grow in this country are self-fertile, and the figs will develop without the help of wasps.

For some years now it has been my custom to make a figgy pudding at Christmas, as mentioned in the old carol, 'We Wish you a Merry Christmas'. It has suet and flour, dried figs and spice, and I serve it flamed in brandy, with a white sauce poured over. If I could buy some syrup of figs these days, it might be nice to pour a drop into the pudding mixture – but not too much!

Defence Committee to visit BBC

Members of the Defence Committee are to visit BBC Monitoring at its Caversham Park site, following an invitation from Reading East MP, Rob Wilson.

Earlier this year, the BBC announced cuts of £4 million to its BBC Monitoring operational budget, which will see approximately 100 jobs axed and the organisation relocated from its Caversham Park base – its home for over 70 years.

Rob is opposed to this decision, arguing that in an increasingly volatile world, where the UK faces unprecedented and unpredictable threats, the open-source intelligence being observed, analysed, translated and communicated by BBC Monitoring to Government departments has never been more vital to our national security.

This view is shared by the chairman of the Defence Committee, Dr Julian Lewis, who has joined Rob in stating publicly his opposition to the BBC's proposed cuts.

This mutual interest prompted Rob to write to Dr Lewis and invite the Defence Committee to visit Caversham Park to gain a first-hand understanding of how its specialised output will be affected by cuts to its funding.

The visit will contribute to the parallel investigations being undertaken by the Defence and Foreign Affairs Committees into the operations of BBC Monitoring.

Speaking in anticipation of the visit Rob said "I consider the decision to be deeply misguided and detrimental to our national interests – both in terms of our own security and intelligence capabilities, but also our world-wide influence and engagement with international partners"

Dr Lewis said: "Caversham Park is to open source intelligence what Bletchley Park was to secret intelligence and that is why it is of vital interest to the defence of the United Kingdom. The fact that it has been continually cut is of grave concern and any further cuts will have a significant impact upon national security".

Reading Library Service Launch New eBook Service

In October Reading Library Service launched a new eBook service, offering members the opportunity to download books from a choice of hundreds of popular titles.

The new service is accessed through the cloud Library app available through visiting <http://yourcloudlibrary.com/index.php/en-us> or from the App Store, Mac OS or Google Play.

The library's eBook collection includes many popular adult and children's titles, ranging from Lee Child to Bill Bryson, to J K Rowling and more.

All that is needed to get started is an active library card and PIN.

The app makes it simple to download titles, save reads for later and even read across multiple devices. Members can borrow up to four books at one time and keep them for up to 21 days. There are no overdue fines.

The cloudLibrary app is compatible with the following devices: iPad, iPhone, iPod Touch, Android Phones, Android Tablets, NOOK Tablets, NOOK eReaders, Kobo eReaders and Kindle Fires.

Cllr Paul Gittings, Reading's Lead Member for Culture, said: "Accessing books online couldn't be easier for our library members now. Once you have accessed the cloudLibrary you can browse, borrow and start reading straight away. You can keep the eBook for three weeks and what's even better, there are no overdue fines to worry about! For anyone unsure on how to access an eBook, there is also help available at the library."

"God is my shepherd. God makes sure I always have everything I need.

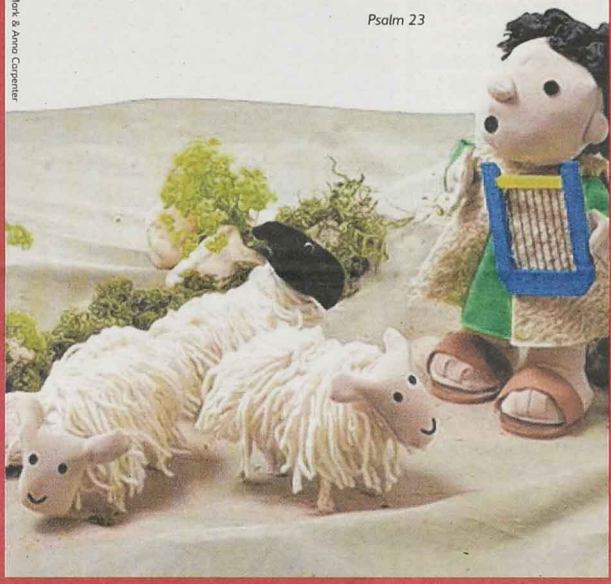
God leads me to beautiful places, where I can rest.

For advice, Fr Paul approached Jeremy Meager, general manager of Viscount Organs, whom he knew from his Bicester days. After investigating the cost of restoration compared with buying a new organ, the decision was made to buy new, and this received diocesan approval.

Just as this decision was made, a legacy from the estate of the late Ian Cane was handed to the parish. Ian had been a member of the choir for many years until his death two years ago and he had a great love and knowledge of music. It seemed that to use the bulk of the inheritance to pay for the new organ would have been what he would have wished.

Jeremy agreed to supply a two manual instrument with many added extras which Ian's money paid for. The money left over went to the Church and Shrine restoration fund.

The organ has been installed and is now in use.

A dedication ceremony took place during the ten o'clock mass on 20th November, the feast of Christ the King, which was the day before Ian's anniversary.

Jeremy Meager supplied the organ used for Pope Benedict's mass for the beatification of Cardinal Newman and the recently installed organ in St Peter's church was also supplied by Viscount, so Our Lady and St Anne's church is in good company.

Harvest Mass at St Anne's

The church was filled with the children from St Anne's school and parishioners for the Harvest Mass. A formal display had been arranged in front of the Altar.

Each class had collected non perishable goods for days before and pupils from each class carried the boxes they had filled as the classes processed into church and placed the goods in the sanctuary in front of the altar. The reception class box was brought in a trolley and the children each carried a tin of food from it and placed it with the other offerings.

Fr Paul talked to the children during mass about the harvest and about the Reading Food Bank. Pupils read the bidding prayers and all joined in the harvest related hymns.

The food was later collected by representatives from the Reading food bank to add to their store. It would be parcelled up and distributed to needy families.

The Haiti disaster has slipped from the headlines but the need is desperate with many families, having lost everything are sleeping in the open and totally dependant on food drops. Not only is there a very great need for help now but many crops were destroyed and the future looks extremely bleak for whole communities.

This disaster happened at a time when the country was still struggling to recover from the earthquake of a few years ago. The money raised will go some way to help aid which is already being provided.

This was the fourth silent auction the church has held, with the aim of making a speedy response to international tragedies. In excess of £5000 has been raised – thanks to people's generosity.

Two weeks later at the church's Autumn Fair over £1,500 was raised for Headway – the charity that helps people with head injuries.

The church would like to thank everyone in the community who supported these two very worthwhile events.

Caversham Court Christmas tree sale

Nowadays, everyone is looking for the *green option*, and indeed green is one of the traditional colours for Christmas. So, why not go for a truly green solution for Christmas and in turn help both a local charity and biodiversity? Many of you may have seen the report on Autumnwatch where the effects of the planting of softwood conifer plantations to help provide pit props after World War II has had a detrimental impact on lowland heaths, where the conifers have severely impaired the growth of wild heathers, by desiccating the soil and over enriching it when they drop their needles.

This area is important nationally and internationally for its areas of lowland heath, and volunteers in the area have been working hard on this for over a quarter of a century. They have found a good seasonal way to not only resolve the problem of the conifers depriving groundcover plants such as heather of water, but also raising funds into the bargain. They have been cutting the Scots Pine in early December, and selling the best ones as Christmas trees – a win win result on the green stakes.

Initially, people had a reluctance to try the Scots Pine as a Christmas tree as they are not as dense as say a Douglas Fir. However, now many people return year after year for the trees for a lovely fragrant tree, which may have decorations of its own in the form of cones and will not drop needles all over your lounge floor. So, you can bring a Berkshire tree into your home and help the local heathland management with valuable funds.

The trees initially came from Bucklebury Common, but over the years the scheme has extended to cover land at Wildmoor in Bracknell, Caesar's Camp at Padworth and more recently they had worked in association with the MOD to bring areas of the Special Protection Area at Camberley under active management.

But the trees are not the only local decoration that you can use and be green. Reading Urban Wildlife Group planted 6000 willow trees from local stock as part of a millennium project. This original planting was completed with the assistance of 400 volunteers all co-ordinated by Econet (www.econetreading.org.uk) Part of that project was a willow arboretum at Kings Meadow and beds of coppiced willow that can be

used by local willow workers. These plots are harvested annually by the Wildlife Group and volunteers from Conserve Reading on Wednesdays (Crow), part of Econet. The resulting willow has been turned into many things from the sides of watercress beds in Ewelme and raised beds on the roof of RISC, to willow baskets and supports.

Not forgetting of course, willow wreaths and stars, these together with the Christmas Trees can be purchased at Caversham Court on Saturday December 10th between 9:30am and 1:00pm. While there you can watch the skilled designers at work making decorated wreaths or stars. There are also stalls from Fair Trade, RSPCB, and Reading Beekeepers who will have some locally produced candles.

While you are in the area, why not pay a visit to St Peter's Church Christmas Market which is on at the same time where there will be a wide range of handicrafts, games and a raffle plus hot drinks and other refreshments.

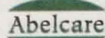

CLUBS

The Caversham Heights Society

October was a busy month for the Society. Following the annual general meeting, which was held on Wednesday 5th, members were enthralled by a fascinating, well-researched and informative talk about crossing the River Thames given by Tony Weston. *Entitled Thames Crossings - From a ford to a flight*. This was a comprehensive history of how crossing the Thames has evolved. At 215 miles long from its source, where there is virtually no water, to its exit into the North Sea, the Thames is the longest river in England. For thousands of years it acted as a barrier between tribes and kingdoms and the only way of getting across was wading, swimming or by boat. The Romans built the first bridge across the river at Staines but when they left, London Bridge fell into disrepair and it was another 500 years before it was replaced by a more substantial bridge. The original was eventually destroyed by a 240mph tornado which struck London in 1091. It is claimed that the nursery rhyme 'London Bridge is falling down' originated from this time though it is much more likely that it was the Great Fire of London in 1666 that destroyed the then seven storey high London Bridge, with its shops and over 200 homes and other buildings, that inspired the song.

When William the Conqueror arrived in 1066 he had to go all the way up to Wallingford before he could cross the river safely at Duxford, near Oxford, both towns where there were fords. It was William I who declared the Thames to be a royal river but it was left to William II (1056-1100) and Stephen (1090-1154) to build a new bridge.

For centuries the main means of crossing the Thames was by ferry. The oldest known one was Gravesend to Tilbury, recorded in the Domesday Book of 1086. It was from here that Elizabeth I addressed her troops before the arrival of the Spanish Armada in 1588. In 1197 Richard I [the Lionheart] sold the river to the Corporation of the City of London who thereafter controlled what was, or was not, allowed. It was not until the reign of Henry VIII that watermen, or ferrymen, were licensed to carry passengers. Of the hundreds of public ferries that once existed only a handful still exist - Woolwich, Hampton, Twickenham, Gravesend to Tilbury, and Hilton Docklands to Canary Wharf.

During medieval times it was the monasteries that built several bridges, (Wallingford in 1200, Radcot in 1200 and Caversham in 1231.) Those built by the monks had pointed arches since these were the designs of their monastic homes but only a few survive. Their real importance was in providing revenues, by way of tolls, for anyone using them. They were also often the sites of battles between rival armies.

During the 18th century there were many competitions and designs for new bridges over the river, and members were shown pictures of several of these. Real change came in 1869 when Isambard Kingdom Brunel began building the first tunnel, the most famous one is the Blackwall tunnel. In more recent years a new approach has been undertaken, namely a means of flying over the river. Perhaps the most bizarre idea of crossing the Thames is the so-called Garden Bridge but this is still mired in controversy and may never be built.

Still on the historical theme, on October 12th a coach full of members went first to Windsor and then to Dorney to be shown round Dorney Court, a medieval manor house first mentioned in the Domesday Book but then rebuilt in Tudor times. It has been owned by the same family, the Palmers, for over 400 years. Going round the house was like a tour through English history, both through furniture as well as through paintings and architecture. Because the house receives no government funding the owners have to rely on using the house and gardens for filming, weddings and corporate functions.

On the 19th of October members were entertained and enthralled by Shaun McCormick's personal insights into the Queen's Bodyguard of the Yeomen of the Guard. After serving in the army for 25 years Shaun became a Yeoman of the Guard in 2000 and has been based at St James' Palace since then. Founded by Henry VII as a bodyguard 'to support the crown and protect and guard the body of our Lord the King'. It is the oldest bodyguard in the world. It is armed and was originally made up of fighting men but today it is largely a ceremonial body of volunteer ex-servicemen. Each time there is a state occasion, such as the Opening of Parliament, the greeting and entertainment of a visiting Head of State, or a Lying in State, investitures, garden parties at Buckingham Palace or the Maundy Thursday services, the Yeomen of the Guard can be seen. Because the Yeomen of the Guard discovered Guy Fawkes beneath Parliament on November 5th, 1605 they still have the responsibility to check the cellars of the Houses of Parliament at each State Opening. The warders at the Tower of London are also part of the Yeomen of the Guard.

Shaun had brought his uniform for members to see and they were amazed at the sheer weight of it all.

CLUBS

Probus

The speaker at the October meeting of the Reading and District Probus Club was Richard Harrison who presented a talk on the subject of *Citizen's Advice*. Richard has been the chairman of the Reading Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB, or CA) for the last few years. CA is the place where people go when they have a problem and have no-one to turn to.

CA was founded as a national body in 1939, and was funded by the government. It has two aims: to provide advice to people in need, and to improve policies and practices affecting people's lives. Nationally, CA was nominated as charity of the year in 2015. CA Reading is a member of the national body, but is independent of it. CA Reading has its own board of trustees, and it has 100 volunteers and 20 part-time staff. It is an advice service in areas which have become increasingly complex, providing advice in the areas of benefits, debt, employment, housing, family and relationships, and consumer issues.

CA Reading is open five days a week. It recruits and trains volunteers, and ensures that qualified advisers are available. It is independently audited. In a typical year, it will see over 6000 clients, deal with over 15000 issues, and will have gained over £2million for clients.

In the area of benefits, it will identify the correct benefits (the system is very complex), and assist with process. It will chase delays, appeal decisions, and assist with overpayments.

In advising people with debts, it helps with escalating debt, and assists with emergencies, such as court action, bailiffs, eviction. It will agree a financial statement and negotiate priorities.

People using CA are typically facing unexpected crises, have difficulty understanding their problems, and are vulnerable.

CA has a small management team and a professional training department. It no longer receives guaranteed grant funding (it has a grant from Reading borough council), and now has to compete for funding. Grants are being cut: it loses 25% this year, and 50% next year. To improve the funding situation it has to strictly control costs, and adopt a proactive approach to securing funding, such as providing training services commercially, doing direct fundraising, and seeking business and individual support.

Reasons for supporting CA are that it is local, is dedicated to the community, has a long history, is well-respected, its trustees are not paid, nor are its volunteers. CA are pioneers of the Reading Advice Network.

In the future, without financial help, it would have to restrict the support it can give, and in the extreme, closure is a possible threat. It costs £1500 and takes 12 months to train a volunteer. People can help by making a single or regular donation, leaving a legacy, running an event etc. Gift Aid can add 25% to funds raised.

Probus is a club for retired men, who enjoy a meal once a month in the congenial company of like-minded men. Lunch is followed by a talk, which may be on a variety of interesting subjects. 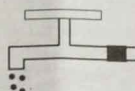
